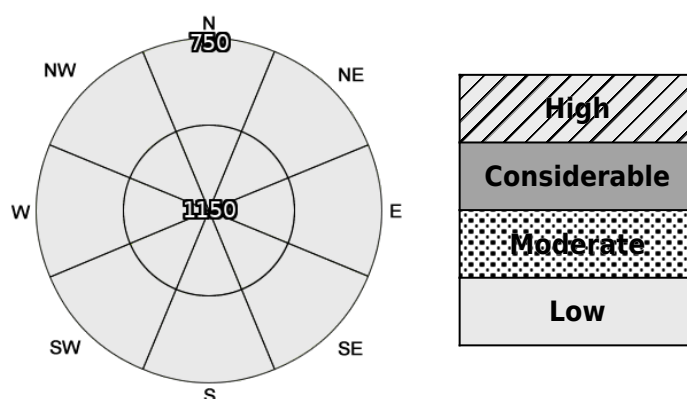


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE LOW**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Thursday 27/01/2022****Avalanche Problems****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

New snow amounts are not expected to be deep or extensive mainly a light thin cover above 850 metres and lying mostly on bare ground. On North to Easterly aspects above 850 metres the old patchy snowpack will re-freeze, will be firm, well bonded and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Low.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Overnight, rain and strong Westerly winds. During the day the freezing level will lower to around 900 metres and light precipitation will fall as snow, mainly above 800 metres. The strong Westerly winds will ease and veer to become West-North-Westerly.

Comments

Tomorrow's new snow amounts expected mostly to be a dusting on arriving on bare ground.
