

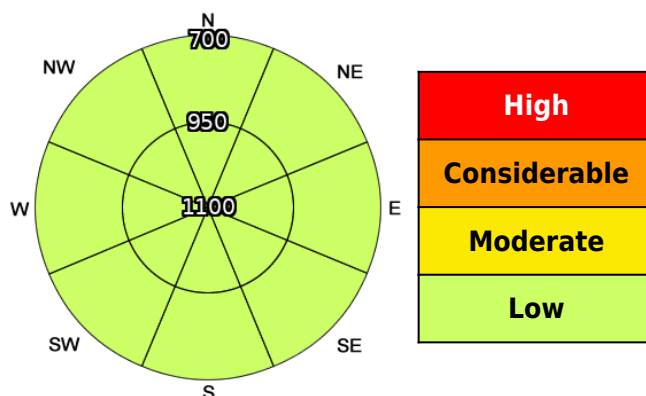

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Saturday 29/01/2022

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The existing snowpack is limited in extent and will remain well bonded and stable. The greatest amounts can be found on North through East to South-East aspects above 950 metres. Shallow wet snow instabilities will exist in recent deposits, these being mostly limited to very steep locations. A light dusting of snow to lower elevations will be inconsequential. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

An unsettled period ahead. Precipitation is expected initially falling as rain overnight at all elevations. This will gradually turn to snow during day light hours, this lying above 500 metres by the end of the period. Snow amounts are likely to be small. The freezing level will drop from above the summits to 600 metres later. Winds will be storm force and from the West-South-West, veering to the West-North-West and easing slightly during the day.

Comments

Rockfall noted in Coire Ardair today with thaw conditions prevailing.
