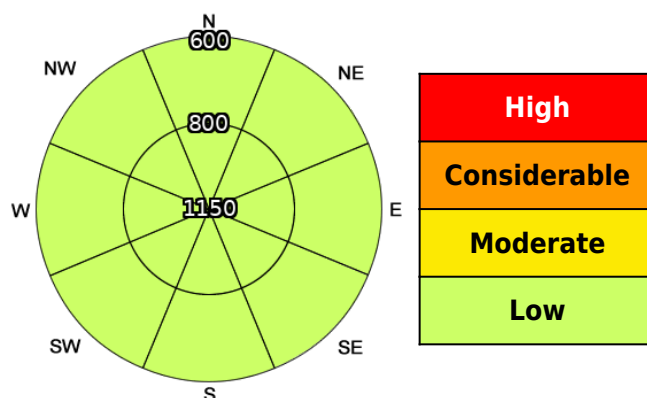


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE LOW**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Tuesday 01/02/2022****Avalanche Problems****Cornices****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Overnight the snowpack will become moist as light rain and milder conditions affect the area. A return to cooler and dry conditions will start to re-freeze the surface of the snowpack. Surface instabilities may persist in sheltered gullies and on North-East to South-Easterly aspects where any deeper accumulations of soft snow remain. Cornices will be fragile. The avalanche hazard will be Low.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Winds will be strong to gale force generally Westerly throughout the period. Precipitation on Monday evening will fall as snow initially on higher slopes before turning to rain at all levels as the freezing level rises well above the summits. A return to cooler and dry conditions later in the night and on Tuesday will see the freezing level lower to around 900 metres by the end of the day.

Comments

New snow amounts on Monday night are not expected to be great. Cold with summit gales expected on Tuesday.
