

**Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

The snowpack for much of the period will remain generally moist with good stability. New snow towards the end of the day will form localised areas of unstable windslab with greatest deposits in the tops of gullies and Northerly to Easterly aspects above 900 metres, these areas are not expected to achieve depth or be extensive and should generally be avoidable. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



**Forecast Weather Influences**

Rain, heavy at times with occasional sleet at the highest levels will affect the area overnight, light snow showers through the day will become heavier towards evening. Strong to gale force winds will generally be South-Westerly. The freezing level will remain above the summits for most of the period but lowering rapidly to 600 metres in the late afternoon.

**Comments**

Stability will remain good for much of the day, new snow late afternoon may form localised areas of windslab in sheltered areas, in particularly where old snow underlies.
