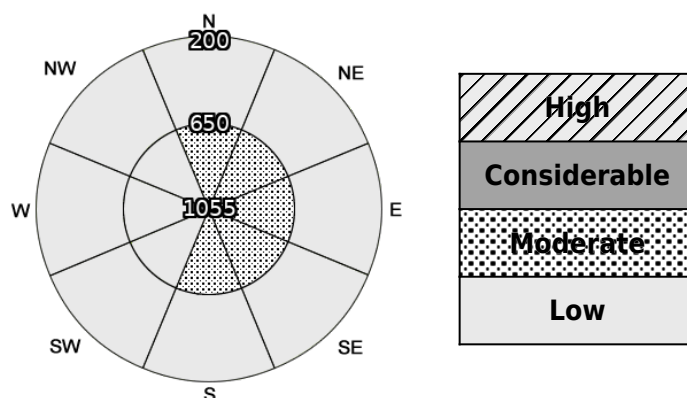


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE MODERATE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Thursday 10/02/2022****Avalanche Problems****Wind Slab****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Moderately bonded windslab will continue to develop on North, through East to South aspects above 650 metres. Areas most affected will be wind sheltered locations especially coire rims, gully exits and ridge flanks. The old snowpack will be stable, well bonded and firm. Wind exposed terrain will be scoured. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Overnight strong to gale force South-Westerly winds will gradually veer to become moderate North-Westerly. Freezing level will rise to 600 metres overnight before lowering to 300 metres by the end of the day. Snow showers throughout the period.

Comments

Further snow showers expected, more forecasted for inland ranges away from the coast. The old snow was firm and icy in places today.
