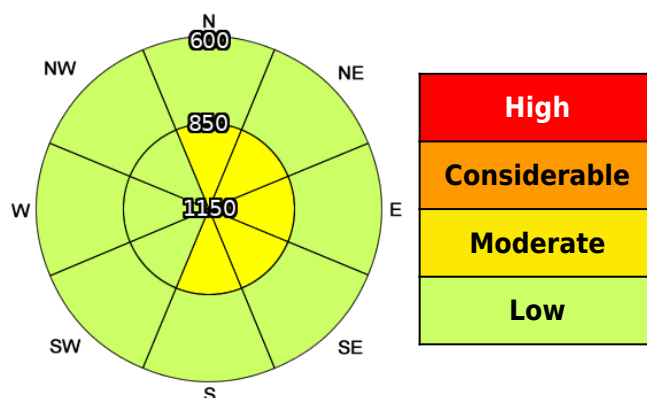


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE MODERATE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Tuesday 15/02/2022****Avalanche Problems****Wind Slab****Cornices****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Unstable windslab will build, mainly on North-East to South-East aspects above 850 metres with more limited amounts on North and South aspects. Deepest deposits will be found in steep wind sheltered locations such as gully tops and corrie rims. Fragile cornices will form, largest on North-East to South-East aspects. Elsewhere, isolated drifts at lower levels will be encountered with areas exposed to the wind, scoured and bare. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

New snowfall, heaviest around dawn with light showers throughout the day will fall at all levels. Winds, Southerly overnight, becoming gale force Westerlies throughout the day. The 500 metre freezing level will rise to 600 metres, later falling to 500 metres again.

Comments

Old snow is becoming very firm, often with short run outs onto bare ground.
