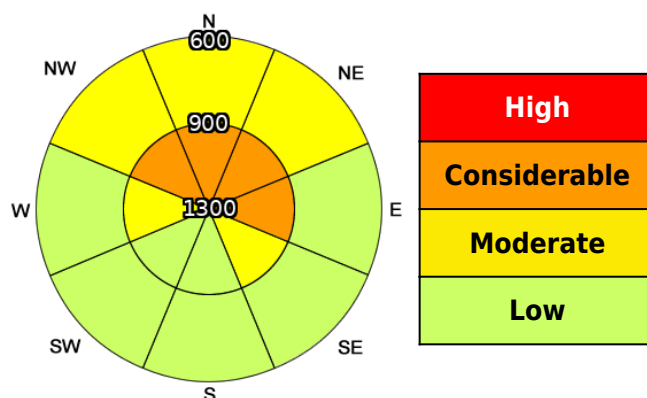

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable windslab will develop mainly on North-West through North to Easterly aspects. Areas most affected will be above 900 metres in wind sheltered locations, particularly below coire rims, gully tops, and crag aprons. Fragile cornices will also develop. On these aspects more localised windslab will develop on steep banks below 900 metres. Cross loading will affect other aspects. Elsewhere the snowpack will be firm and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Strong to gale force winds will back and veer between the West-South-West and the South-South-East. From the middle of the night onwards there will be snowfall, this will be heavy at times especially during the afternoon. The 500 metre freezing level will steadily rise and fluctuate at around 800 metres.
