
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will be well bonded and stable in most locations. Localised deposits of moderately bonded windslab will gradually develop, on North-West through North to East aspects above 1000 metres. These deposits are not expected to be extensive and be confined to wind sheltered locations such as gully tops and coire rims. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Showers will fall as snow above 1100 metres overnight turning to snow above 700 metres by the end of the day. The freezing level will be around the summits overnight falling to 800 metres by the end of the day. Very strong Southerly winds, will decrease to moderate and veer South-Westerly by morning.

Comments

A calmer, drier day on Tuesday before windspeeds increase from the South-East on Wednesday.
