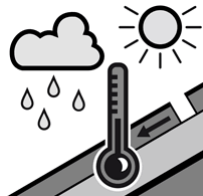
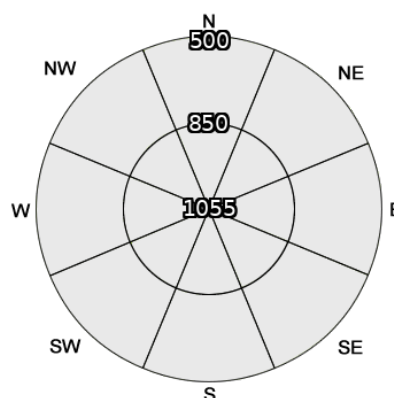

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will remain generally stable on all aspects, with some isolated shallow accumulations building onto steep wind sheltered terrain above 850 metres. These accumulations will be isolated forming around coire rims and steep scarp slopes on North through East to South-East aspects. At lower levels there will be some softening of the snowpack. The avalanche hazard will be Low.


Forecast Weather Influences

There will be South to South-Westerly winds overnight, weakening slightly to become strong South-Westerly. Overnight freezing levels will be around 1000 to 1100 metres, then lowering through the day to 600 metres by the end of the forecast period. It will be dry at first then light scattered snow showers overnight and tomorrow.

Comments

Severe gale to storm force Southerly summit winds easing and veering as the weather fronts clear to the East.
