
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will remain firm, well-bonded and generally stable on all aspects and altitudes above 600 metres. Isolated accumulations of shallow windslab will be re-distributed on West to North aspects above 950 metres. These accumulations will be localised and generally avoidable. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Temperature inversion conditions are expected with no precipitation, giving a dry day with extended periods of sunshine. Fog developing by late afternoon. South-South-East winds will steadily gain strength to be near gale force by early morning and storm force by the end of the forecast period. The freezing level will remain at the snowline.

Comments

Strong winds and firm snow, steep slopes and crag aprons will continue to have serious runouts.
