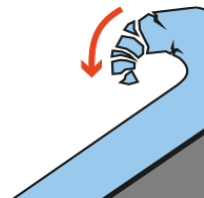
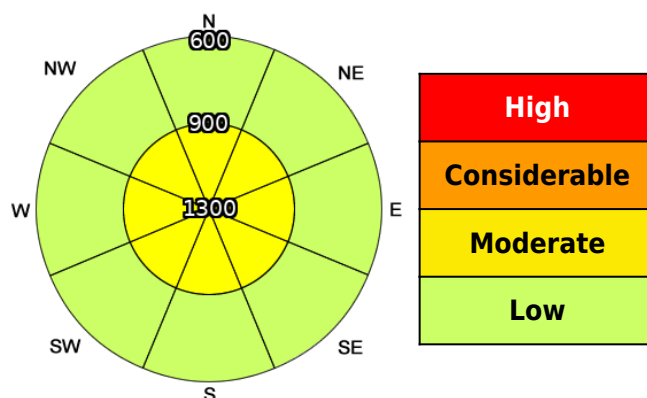


**THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE MODERATE****Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Monday 07/03/2022****Avalanche Problems****Wind Slab****Cornices****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Drifting snow. Unstable windslab will develop and become more widespread through the course of the forecast period on North-West to North-East aspects above 900 metres. Areas most affected will be steep wind sheltered locations, gully exits and below coire rims. Fragile cornices will develop. Cross loading onto other aspects. Unstable windslab around coire rims on Southerly facing slopes will gradually erode. Elsewhere will be icy and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Dry conditions are expected throughout the forecast period with sunny spells developing during the afternoon. Moderate to strong Southerly winds will increase through the afternoon and back to become South-South-Easterly in direction. Zero degrees C at around summit levels, cooler later in the day, but the air mass over the mountains will remain cold due to inversion conditions.

**Comments**

Winds picking up through the afternoon. Steep slopes are firm and icy with serious run out potential.
