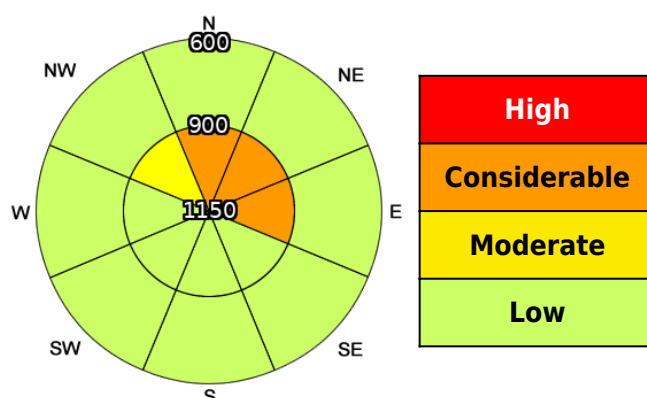


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE CONSIDERABLE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Thursday 10/03/2022****Avalanche Problems****Wind Slab****Wet Snow****Cornices****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Wet snow instabilities will exist where deeper accumulations of recent snow have formed in summit gullies and on steep slopes with a mainly North-Westerly to Easterly aspect above 900 metres. Cornices above these areas will be suspect. Cooler conditions later in the day will aid the consolidation process. At lower levels the snowpack will be soft and moist with a gradual reduction of cover. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

New snow overnight then light rain or snow through the day. The freezing level will rise well above the summits lowering by evening to around 700 metres. Daytime winds will generally be Southerly strong.

Comments

Hazard of falling rocks and ice also weak snow bridges will exist across some streams which can be deeply recessed in places. Snowpack conditions are expected to improve later in the day as the freezing level lowers.
