



Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Wet snow instabilities will persist, and localised unstable windslab will develop, on West through North to North-East aspects above 1000 metres. Areas especially affected will be within steep and convex terrain, such as below coire rims, gully exits and crag aprons. Cornices will remain unstable. Elsewhere the snowpack will be generally well bonded, soft and thawing at lower altitudes. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Gale force South-South-East winds will gradually ease through the forecast period to become moderate South, then South-Westerly during the afternoon. A mostly dry night followed by light snowfall during the day. The freezing level will fluctuate between summit levels and 1000 metres.

Comments

Very wet underfoot conditions today.
Cornice collapse, rock and ice fall will remain a potential hazard.
