
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The existing snowpack will be generally well bonded and stable. Its surface will refreeze above around 900 metres. Some new windslab will be deposited in wind-sheltered areas, mainly on North to East aspects above 900 metres. Accumulations are not expected to gain significant depth or be extensive. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Winds will be strong throughout the period, initially West-South-Westerly then backing to become South-South-Westerly during the evening. Some light snowfall above around 850 metres is expected this evening, then a dry night. Some light showers during the day, falling as snow above around 600 metres rising to 800 metres. The freezing level will rise to around 900 metres during the afternoon.

Comments

There is a chance of slightly heavier more persistent snowfall above 800m during the later afternoon. If this occurs windslab accumulations will be deeper and more extensive.
