




Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Fresh deposits of unstable windslab will be deposited in wind-sheltered areas, mainly on North-West through North to East aspects above 900 metres. Accumulations are not expected to gain depth or be extensive. Gully tops, coire rims and ridge flanks will be most affected. Fragile cornices will start to build. The old snowpack will generally be well bonded and stable, and mostly refrozen. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Winds will initially be strong Southerly, then veering and easing during the evening to become light to moderate mainly West-South-Westerly from midnight onwards. Overnight some light snowfall above 900 metres is expected, then a dry day. The freezing level will be 1000 metres, lowering to around 800 metres.

Comments

The surface of the old snowpack will mainly be refrozen, hard and icy.
