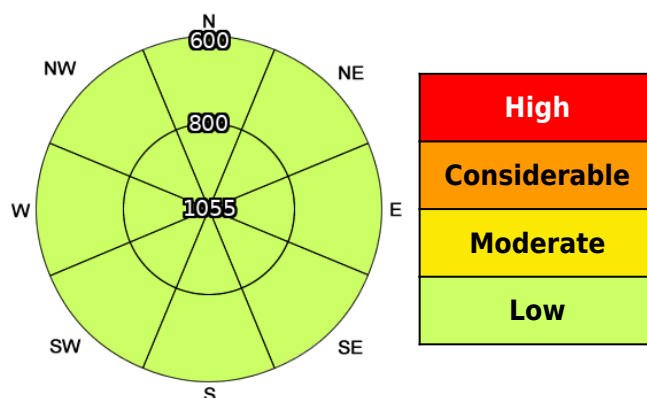


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE LOW**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Thursday 17/03/2022****Avalanche Problems****Wind Slab****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Isolated, shallow and mostly avoidable accumulations of windslab will develop on steep wind sheltered North to North-East aspects above 800 metres. The old snowpack will generally be well bonded and firm in places. The avalanche hazard will be Low.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Strengthening Southerly winds overnight will become gale force by daybreak, veering to Westerly in the afternoon. Snow and rain showers expected during daylight hours. The freezing level will be around 600 metres overnight, rising to summit level by midday before dropping to 600 metres by the end of forecast period.

Comments

Gales force winds expected tomorrow will be accompanied by snow and rain showers.
