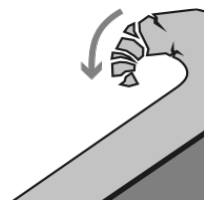
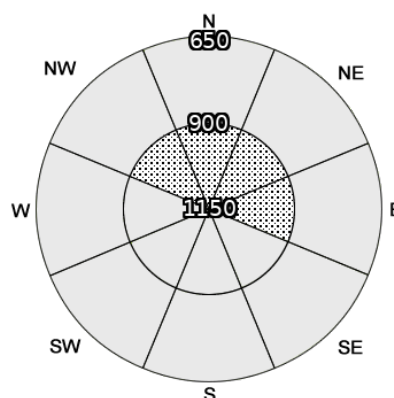


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE MODERATE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Thursday 17/03/2022****Avalanche Problems****Wind Slab****Cornices****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

New snow will form areas of poorly bonded windslab in wind sheltered locations adding to existing windslab deposits. Greatest accumulations will be in sheltered gullies and on steep slopes with a North-West through North to Easterly aspect mainly above 900 metres. Where these windslab accumulations achieve significant depth they will be moderately bonded. Elsewhere the snowpack will be generally well bonded. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Overnight, the freezing level will be around 700 metres, it will rise to 1100 metres by midday then fall to 800 metres in the afternoon. After a dry night precipitation will fall as snow above 600 metres rising to 950 metres before falling to 800 metres. Moderate Southerly winds will strengthen becoming strong, South-Westerly by early morning.

Comments

Fluctuating freezing levels will give varying amounts snow.
