
Avalanche Hazard Forecast - FOR PERIOD 18:00HRS Sat 19/03/2022 TO 18:00HRS Sun 20/03/2022



Hazard Level	Avalanche Probabilty
Very High	Natural and human triggered avalanches will occur. Numerous very large, often extremely large natural avalanches can be expected.
High	Natural and human triggered avalanches will occur. In some cases, numerous large, often very large sized natural avalanches can be expected.
Considerable	Natural and human triggered avalanches possible, in some cases large, in isolated cases very large sized natural avalanches are possible.
Moderate:	Very large sized natural avalanches are unlikely. Human triggering possible in indicated steep places.
Low	Only small and medium sized natural avalanches are possible. Human triggering possible in steep, extreme terrain.

Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight, a slight temperature inversion will take place. It will remain dry, sunny and generally mild with the freezing level above the summits. Winds will be strong South-Easterly.

Forecast Snow Stability and Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will re-freeze overnight and consolidate remaining generally well bonded and stable in all locations. Isolated surface instabilities may develop on slopes exposed to the sun during the day. Cornices will be prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Low.

Observed Avalanche Hazard - Sat 19/03/2022

Observed Weather Influences

A dry and sunny day with plenty of solar radiation. The winds were fresh from a variable Southerly direction and the freezing level was above all the summits. It was 16.2 degrees Celsius at sea level at midday.

Observed Snow Stability and Avalanche Hazard

Last night the snowpack re-froze and is generally well bonded and stable in all locations The icy surface layer in the morning soften during the course of the day particularly on slopes exposed to the direct sunshine leading to some minor wet snow instabilities on steeper slopes. Cornices were fragile. The avalanche hazard is Low.

Mountain Conditions

Observed Mountain Travel Conditions Hard snow ice in the morning mainly above 750 metres softening as the day progressed. Good visibility. Variable Southerly winds 15-25 mph on the tops.

Comments Icy snowpack early morning. Cornices fragile and unstable.
