



Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Monday 28/03/2022

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The remaining snow will be well bonded and stable throughout. Firmer slopes expected at first, with surface layers softening later as the morning warms up. Cloud cover developing with less severe thaw conditions expected on South facing slopes than recently experienced. Greatest areas of snow will be found on the highest plateau areas and in North to East facing corries above 900 metres. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

High pressure will remain in place for the next forecast period with another cold, clear night expected. Dry, sunny conditions at first on Monday morning with cloud building around midday. Light Northerly winds initially, backing West-North-Westerly during the afternoon.

A return to more normal weather conditions for March on Tuesday with snow showers forecast.
