

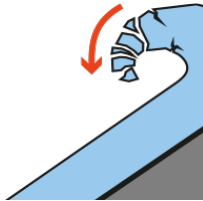

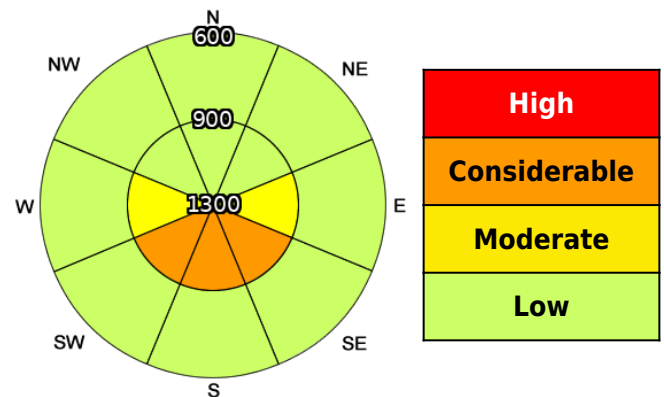
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Additional unstable windslab will continue to build in wind sheltered locations throughout the forecast period. Mostly on South-East to South-West aspects above 900 metres, especially gully tops, coire rims and convexities. East and West aspects will also be affected due to cross loading. Fragile cornices will also be present on these aspects. On other aspects and at lower elevations unconsolidated but a stable snow cover will be present. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight strong Northerly winds will ease during the day. Light snow showers are expected this evening, clearing to bring a dry morning then further snow showers developing in the afternoon. The freezing level will be around 400 metres rising to 600 metres by late morning.

Comments

Proper winter conditions today with poor visibility, drifting snow, very cold temperatures and strong Northerly winds. The cold, wintry conditions are set to continue into the weekend. So if you are heading for the mountains over the next couple of days be prepared.
