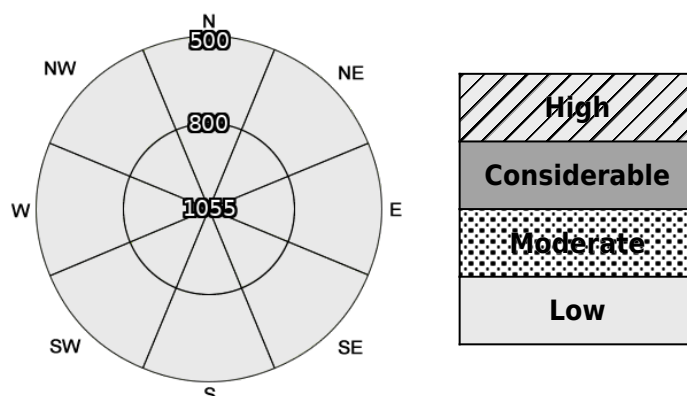
Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New snow amounts are not expected to be significant. Any deeper accumulations are likely to be on steep wind sheltered North-East and East aspects above 700 metres, but will generally be avoidable. Otherwise, the patchy old snowpack will be firm, well bonded and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Snow showers will peter out overnight, but build again through the morning, becoming more frequent over the coastal mountains. The fresh Northerly wind will moderate and back South-West by dawn, returning North-Westerly later. The freezing level will lower to 300 metres overnight, rising to 600 metres in the afternoon.

Comments

More frequent snow showers are expected over the more coastal mountains. Becoming mild and unsettled by the end of the weekend.
