






Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New snow amounts will be slight and will quickly thaw as the freezing level rises above all summits, accompanied by rain. The stable, frozen older snowpack will start to thaw but should remain generally stable. In the transition period, localised surface wet snow instabilities may be present in new snow fall on steep North to Easterly aspects mainly above 900 metres. Any remaining cornices will be prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight, dry, calm and cold, with the freezing at around 700 metres. These conditions should continue through most of the morning. Then the freezing level will start to rise becoming well above the summits by mid afternoon. Snow showers at first turning to rain at all levels. The Westerly winds will steadily strengthen through the day becoming Gale Force by mid afternoon.

Comments

Forecast is for a return to stormy mild conditions for the next couple of days.
