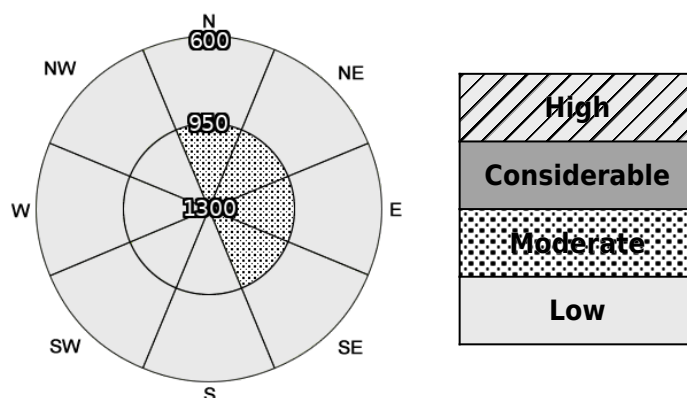
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Localised deposits of fresh unstable windslab will develop through the day, mainly on North through East to South-East aspects above 950 metres. Areas most affected will be steep wind sheltered terrain such as gully tops and coire rims. Deposits are only expected to gain significant depth during the afternoon, as the wind speed increases and snow is redistributed. Elsewhere the snowpack will be generally stable. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

After a dry morning showers will develop in the afternoon, initially snow above 700 metres turning to rain at all levels by the end of the afternoon. West-South-Westerly winds will be light in the morning gradually increasing to strong during the afternoon. The freezing level will rise above the summits towards the end of the afternoon.
