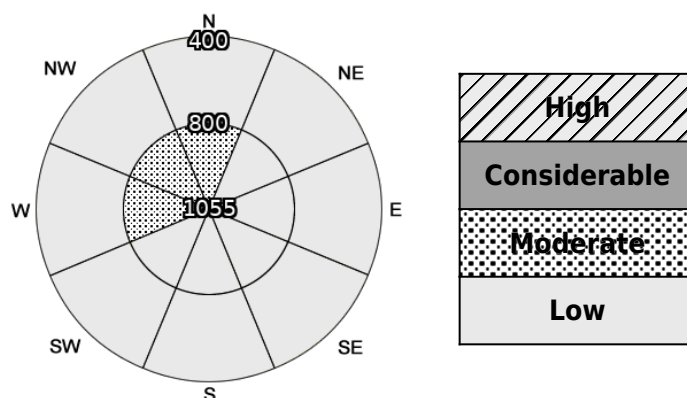


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE MODERATE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Tuesday 05/04/2022****Avalanche Problems****Wind Slab****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

By the end of the forecast period, there will be pockets of unstable windslab building in steep wind sheltered terrain, mainly on West to North aspects above 800 metres. Typically, coire rims and ridge flanks will be affected and it will be generally lying on bare ground. The patchy old snow will be refrozen and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Snow is forecast throughout the period, greatest amounts in the afternoon and generally lying above 400 metres elevation. Fresh Northerly winds will become light overnight, veering Easterly and freshening again through the day. The freezing level will progressively drop to around 500 metres by dawn, lower inland.

Comments

There is uncertainty over the snow amounts during the next forecast period, as milder weather with rain and high freezing levels may arrive later in the day,
