

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Further areas of moderately bonded windslab will continue develop in wind sheltered locations. North to Easterly aspects above 900 metres will be particularly affected with deepest accumulations in steep sheltered gullies, scarp slopes and coire headwalls. New snow deposits will also develop on all other aspects but these will mainly be lying on bare ground and are not expected to be extensive. New cornices will be fragile. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight, the freezing level will lower to around 400 metres before rising to 700 metres during the day. Snow showers mainly above 400 metres and heaviest overnight, these will continue through the day and lessen. Fresh, Southerly winds will back, strengthen then decrease becoming North-North-Westerly.

Comments

A cold arctic maritime air across Scotland is forecast with Northerly winds and snow showers for Thursday night and Friday, brighter on Saturday.
