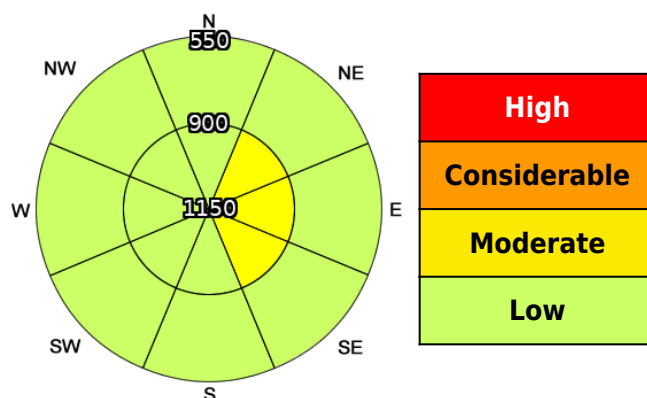


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE MODERATE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Saturday 09/04/2022****Avalanche Problems****Wind Slab****Cornices****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

General snowpack stability will be good but areas of wind slab will continue to develop in wind sheltered summit gullies and steep coire headwalls with a mainly North-East to South-East aspect above 900 metres. Stability in these localised areas will remain suspect. With only light scattered snow showers expected these areas are not expected to be deep or extensive. Fresh cornices above lee slopes will be fragile. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Light scattered snow showers and mainly fresh to strong West-North-Westerly winds will affect the area. The freezing level overnight will be around 400 metres rising to 700 metres through the day.

Comments

The cold West-North-Westerly airflow will continue with scattered light snow showers through the period. Wind transport of new snow and existing deposits will form isolated areas of wind slab in wind sheltered and shaded areas. Some exposed slopes will be firm and icy requiring caution.
