

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Tuesday 12/04/2022


Avalanche Problems



Cornices

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New snow amounts overnight are not expected to be significant. Mild and damp conditions by morning will soften and moisten the snowpack in many areas. General snowpack stability will be good in most areas. Localised surface instabilities will exist in summit gully exits and around corrie rims but these areas are not expected to be deep or extensive and should in the main be avoidable. Remaining cornices will be prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

A trace of new snow will affect the highest slopes overnight this will turn to light rain or drizzle by morning. Winds will be East-South-East strong overnight decreasing to moderate through the day. The Freezing level will be well above the summits throughout the period.

Comments

Mild and moist conditions will maintain a slow thaw at all levels. The snowpack will soften and become moist in many areas, some steeper slopes will remain firm and will require caution, there will be an increased risk of cornice collapse, falling rocks and ice.
