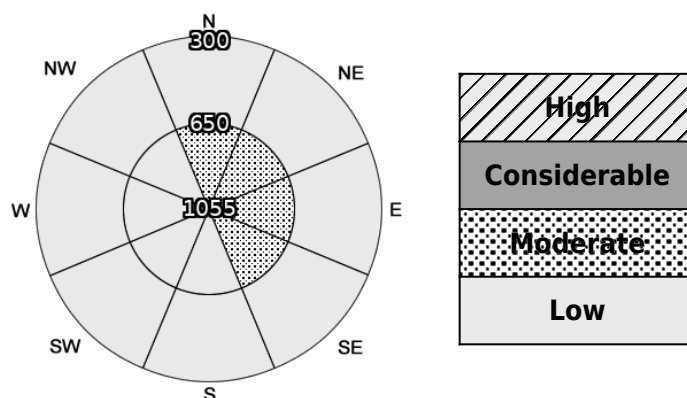


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE MODERATE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Monday 02/01/2023****Avalanche Problems****Wind Slab****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Generally shallow and stable snow cover on all aspects and elevations above 300 metres. However, deeper drifts will persist mainly on North-East to South-East aspects with moderately bonded windslab in steep localised areas same aspects, mostly above 650 metres. Fresh isolated pockets of windslab possible on steep West to North aspects above 800 metres. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Dry overnight, followed by a fine day with the possibility of an isolated light snow shower. The wind will be light to moderate, generally Southerly through the day. The freezing level will gradually rise from 400 metres overnight to around 600 metres by the end of the forecast period.

Comments

It will be a fine day tomorrow but expect the odd light snow shower. Good walking generally, but with deeper drifts in places. Cold on the summits.
