

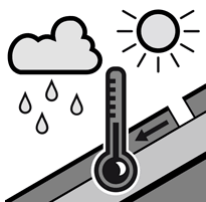

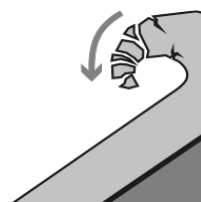

Wind Slab



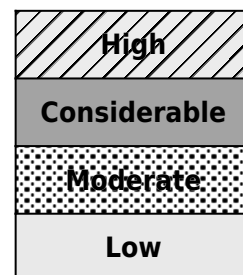
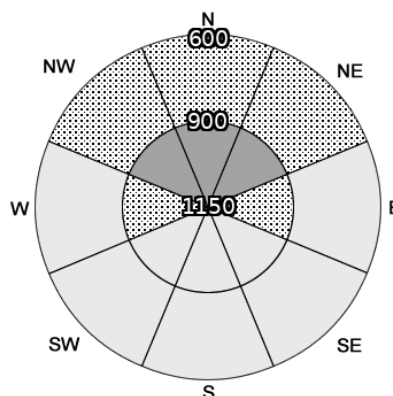

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable windslab will develop mainly above 900 metres in wind sheltered locations on North-West to North-East aspects. West and East aspects will also be affected by localised new accumulations. Stability will be poorest in the afternoon as the freezing level rise with corrie rims, steep scarp slopes and gully exits affected. Cornices will be prone to collapse. Elsewhere localised moderately bonded deposits will also be found in steep lee locations. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Remaining cold overnight with precipitation from dawn. This will fall initially as snow above 600 metres but will turn to rain at all levels as the freezing level rises throughout the day. Winds likely to be very strong in the morning from the South to South-South-East.

Comments

Likely to be a poor day on the hill.
