

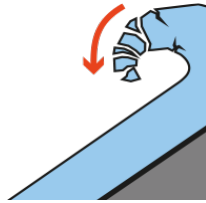

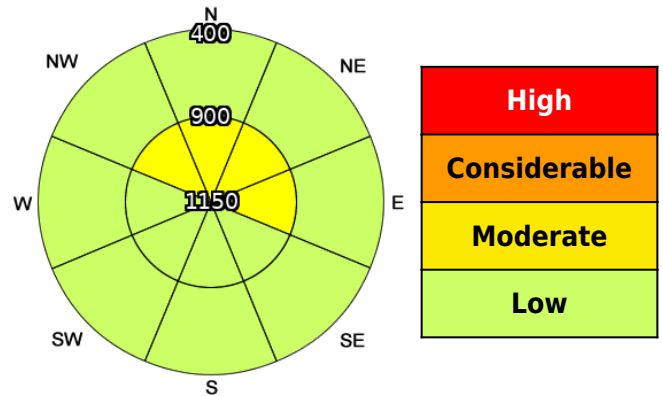

**Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

A period of higher instability will occur overnight as heavy rain affects all levels. Cooler, drier conditions by morning will start to re-freeze the wet snowpack at higher levels assisting the consolidation process. Surface wet snow instabilities will exist initially in localised areas such as gullies and North-West through North to East steep slopes above 900 metres, remaining cornices will be suspect. New snow amounts are not expected to be significant. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



**Forecast Weather Influences**

It will become progressively wetter and milder later on Tuesday evening and into the night. Drier and cooler conditions are expected on Wednesday with the freezing level around 1000 metres. Light snow showers will affect the higher slopes, winds will be West to South-Westerly fresh.

**Comments**

Conditions drying up on Wednesday morning after a wet and mild night, new snow amounts through the day are not expected to be significant. General stability is expected to improve through the course of the day.
