

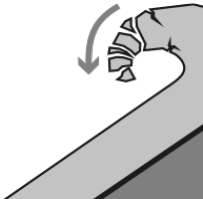

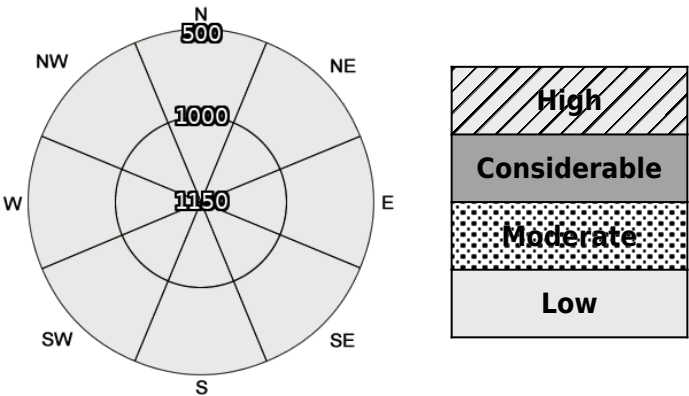
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Mild and wet conditions overnight will moisten the snowpack. Cooler conditions by morning will start to re-freeze the existing snowpack at higher levels giving good general stability. Light falls of new snow through the day will form localised areas of windslab in the most sheltered locations with gully exits and North to Easterly corrie rims most affected. These areas are not expected to be deep or extensive. Any fresh cornices will be fragile. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight the freezing level will rise to around 1700 metres. Rain or sleet will affect all levels. By morning the freezing level is expected to be around 950 metres. Light snow showers will fall above 800 metres. Winds will be generally Southerly fresh in the morning becoming strong later.

Comments

New snow amounts on Saturday not expected to be great but localised instabilities will exist where windslab forms and attains depth on steeper slopes. Outlook is fairly unsettled with widespread snow showers and very strong South-Westerly winds.
