

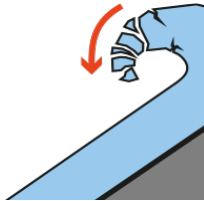

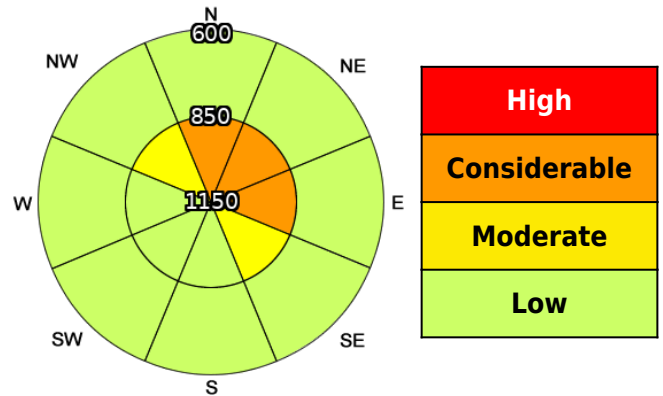
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable windslab will persist and continue to develop throughout the forecast period. Greatest accumulations will be in steep wind sheltered locations mainly on North to East aspects above 850 metres. North-West and South-Easterly aspects will also be affected due to cross loading. Fragile cornices will also exist above many of these aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight, the freezing level will lower to around 800 metres. The strong South-Westerly winds will ease and become fresh, mainly Westerly with snow showers falling mostly above 600 metres becoming less frequent during the day.

Comments

Windslab persisting mainly on North to Easterly aspects above 850m even though the new snow showers will be less frequent.
