

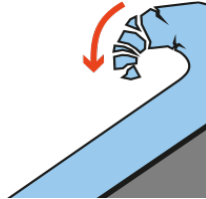

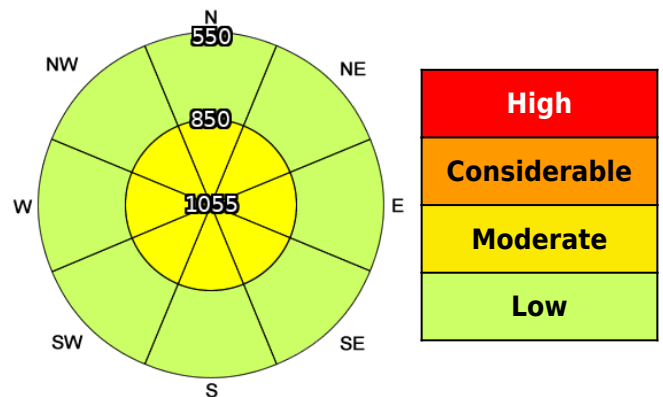

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Areas of moderately bonded wind slab will develop on steeper wind sheltered terrain affecting gullies, scarp slopes and ridge flanks on most aspects above 850 metres. Later some improving stability can be expected on South to West aspects. Some cornice development can be expected on North to East aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

There will be moderate strength East-South East winds at first, backing Northerly overnight and continuing around the compass to become light South-South-West by the end of the period. Showers will be frequent overnight, dryer in Torridon by the morning but with heavier and more prolonged showers further inland away from the sea. The freezing level will lower overnight and hover around 700 metres.

Comments

Winds are to remain changeable with continuing snow showers, merging to longer periods of snow at times and falling as rain below 500m
