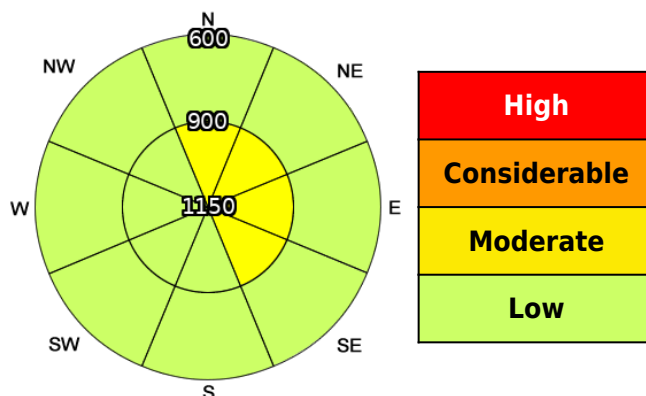

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Areas of unstable windslab will continue to develop in wind sheltered locations on North through East to South-East aspects above 900 metres. Corrie rims, gully exits and scarp slopes will be most affected. Unstable cornices will also continue to develop in these locations. Any exposed terrain will be scoured and icy. Isolated deeper drifts will be encountered in from lower levels. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

The freezing level will be around 750 metres for most of the day. Snow showers, heaviest overnight but easing during the morning. Winds will be strong, South-South-West during the night, veering to North-West, then backing to the West-North-West during the afternoon.

Comments

Forecasted snowfall mostly overnight. Expect old snow and exposed terrain to be firm and icy.
