

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Localised areas of unstable windslab will continue to develop and gain depth in wind sheltered locations on North-West through North to South-East aspects above 950 metres. Areas most affected will be gully tops and coire rims, here cornices continue to develop and be fragile. Wind exposed slopes will be firm and generally stable. Isolated deeper drifts below 950 metres will begin to consolidate in the cooler temperatures. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Snowfall overnight will ease and become showery during the day. The freezing level is expected to initially be around 600 metres lowering to 400 metres. Winds will be moderate in strength, initially from the South-West, then backing South-Easterly overnight, becoming South-Westerly during the daytime.

Comments

Forecasted snowfall overnight with further snow showers during the day and some brighter spells. Old snow and exposed terrain to be firm and icy.
