

##### Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable windslab will continue to gain depth and become widespread on North-East through East to South aspects above 850 metres. Areas most affected will be steep wind sheltered slopes such as gully tops and coire rims. Cornices will be fragile. Other aspects will also be affected due to cross-loading. Wind exposed slopes will be firm and generally stable. At lower elevations, localised deep deposits will develop on steep banks and shallow gullies. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



##### Forecast Weather Influences

Snow showers, during the evening will ease overnight giving a dry day. Fresh North-Westerly winds overnight will by early morning increase to strong and back to become West-North-West for the rest of the forecast period. The freezing level will be around 200 metres.

##### Comments

Snow showers expected to be confined to Sunday evening. Staying cold with strong North-Westerly winds.
