

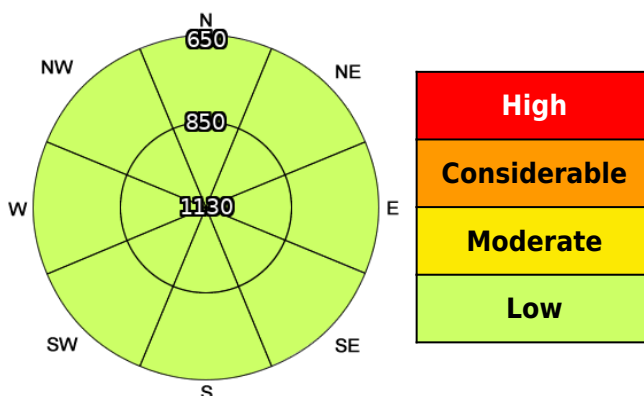

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Sunday 29/01/2023

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The remaining snowpack will re-freeze at higher elevations overnight above 800 metres. New snow amounts are unlikely to be significant, although where they do achieve depth, above 850 metres new snow instabilities and patchy windslab may develop late in the day. These in steepest gully flanks and exits on North through to Easterly aspects. Small, isolated ribbons of old snow will remain down to 600 metres. Good stability on all wind scoured aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

The freezing level will fluctuate overnight, rising to above summits, before lowering again to around 600 metres, after midday. The strong overnight, West-South-West winds will become more blustery and wintry to around 600 metres, as the day progresses.
