
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Drifting deposits will form shallow accumulations of wind slab in wind sheltered locations on North-East through East to South aspects above 700 metres. Deposits are not expected to become significant in depth and will lie on bare ground in many locations. Above 900 metres, localised unstable accumulations will develop over refrozen snow-ice on the steepest terrain. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Precipitation falling as very light snow showers above 500 metres overnight, followed by a dry day. Strong Westerly winds overnight, veering North-Westerly during the morning, then easing as they back to become light South-Westerly by the end of the period Freezing level, initially fluctuating around 650 metres, gradually rising to 800 metres by late afternoon.

Comments

New windslab will display marginal stability when overlaying snow-ice on steepest ground.
