

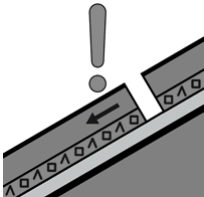

Wind Slab



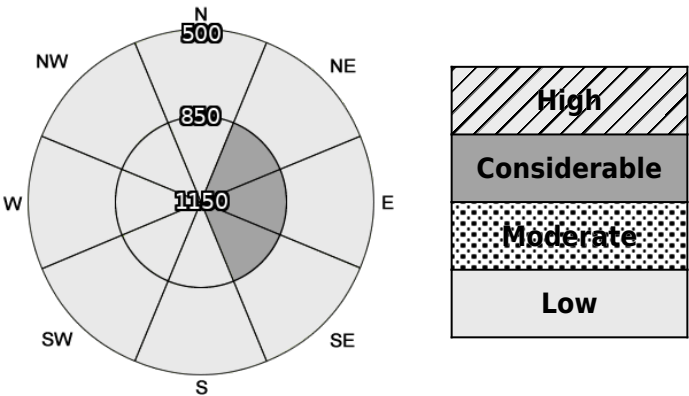
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New snow and wind transport of existing deposits will form areas of unstable windslab in wind sheltered locations. Greatest accumulations will be in sheltered gullies and on slopes with a North-East to South-East aspect mainly above 850 metres. Fragile cornices will continue to form above these areas. Exposed windward slopes will be firm and icy with mainly good stability. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

The very strong generally Westerly airflow will continue overnight with frequent snow showers that will be heavy at times. It will become drier and less windy through the course Wednesday. The freezing level will be around 600 metres.

Comments

Old exposed snow very icy in places, serious consequences exist in the event of an uncontrolled slip or trip.
