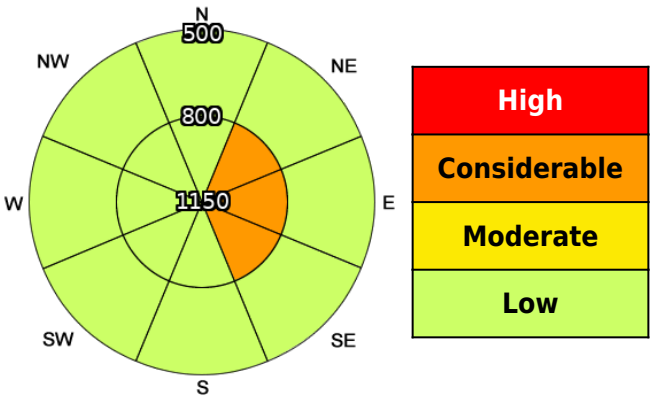

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Overnight or early morning a period of higher instability will occur on areas where accumulations of deeper windslab exist as rain and milder conditions affect the area. Sheltered summit gullies and slopes with a North-East to South-Easterly aspect above 800 metres will be most affected. Cornices will be prone to collapse. Stability is expected to improve as the day progresses. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

There will be a return to milder conditions overnight and through Thursday with persistent rain heavy at times affecting all levels. The freezing level is expected to remain above the summits. Winds will be West-South-West strong to gale force throughout the period.

Comments

Mild windy and wet for Thursday. Expect wet snow instabilities in areas where windslab and cornices exist plus hazard of falling rocks and ice.
