


## THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE LOW

### Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Tuesday 07/02/2023

#### Avalanche Problems

#### Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will be firm, well consolidated and stable in all locations. Greatest amounts of old, firm and icy snow will be on coire headwalls and plateau areas, on North to South-East aspects above 900m. Any new snow is not expected to be significant. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



#### Forecast Weather Influences

A predominantly dry day, with only light snow forecast above 1000m. Gale force South-Westerly winds will ease to moderate in the early hours, then veer West-South-West and steadily increase to very strong throughout the day. The freezing level will decrease to around 1000m.

#### Comments

Due to limited snow cover, exposed rocks and a firm snowpack, runs out have the potential to be serious.
