





Wet Snow






#### Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Little change is expected as the thaw continues. Wet snow instabilities will persist on steep North through East to South-East aspects above 850 metres, such as coire rims, scarp slopes, terraces and gully lines. While above 1000 metres the snow surface will become firm. At lower elevations the snowpack will continue to become depleted and will be soft, saturated and stable. Remaining cornices will be prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



#### Forecast Weather Influences

No precipitation is expected during the forecast period. Winds will be mainly from the South-West, very strong overnight, before decreasing to strong during daylight hours. The freezing level will be around 2800 metres.

#### Comments

Rock fall and cornice collapse a remaining threat as the thaw continues. The snow surface may become firm above 1000 metres.
