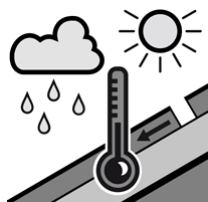


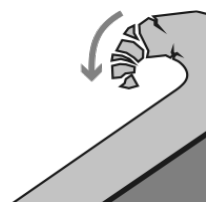

### Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Monday 13/02/2023

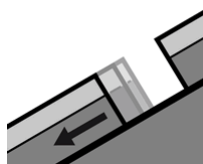
#### Avalanche Problems



Wet Snow



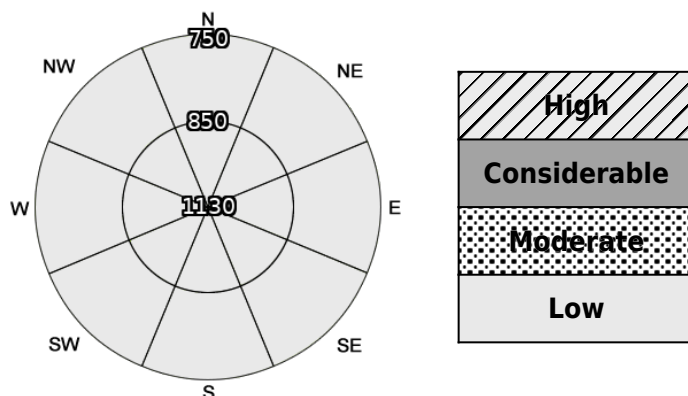
Cornices

#### Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Little change is expected as the thaw continues. Lingering wet snow instabilities will be found in very steep locations on North through East to South-East aspects above 850 metres, such as coire rims, scarp slopes and terraces. The snow surface will quickly soften early in the morning, leaving a moist spring snowpack that is stable and slowly reducing in extent. The threat of cornice collapse remains. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



#### Forecast Weather Influences

A dry day is expected with strong Southerly winds, strengthening briefly around midday to give very strong gusts. The freezing level will be around 2600 metres.

#### Comments

Due to a stable airmass and radiation cooling, the snow surface may be firm above 1000 metres, although quickly softening at all levels by early morning.
