

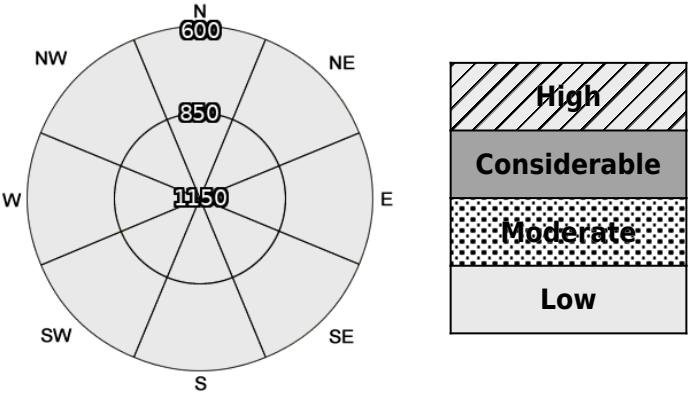

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Monday 13/02/2023

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

There will be little change in the remaining snowpack. It will be stable and well bonded and the surface layers will continue to develop as harder snow-ice. Greatest accumulations will remain on North to East aspects above 850 metres. The main hazard will be the hard snow surface leading to the potential for serious runouts. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

It will be a dry day with some clear spells and occasional sunshine. The freezing level will be at, or around 1000 metres throughout the period. Winds will be mainly Southerly and be fresh on the tops.

Comments

Some good, but limited snowfields still existing in the higher Glencoe coires. Remaining snow firm with serious run out potential into rocks below.
