

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Tuesday 14/02/2023


Avalanche Problems



Cornices

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Little change in the snowpack is expected, remaining well consolidated and stable in all locations. During the day, the snowpack will soften and continue to thaw at all levels. Greatest snow accumulations will be on North through East to South-East aspects above 750m. Cornices remain prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

A predominantly dry day is expected, with the chance of an occasional rain shower. During the day, the freezing level will be above the summits. Strong to very strong Southerly winds.

Comments

The thaw continues and the snowpack will become further depleted at all levels. A threat from rockfall and cornice collapse remains with the freezing level being above the summits.
