



#### Avalanche Problems




Wind Slab

#### Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable windslab will continue to be deposited overnight, mainly onto North to East aspects above 950 metres. Areas most affected will be steep wind sheltered areas such as coire and plateau rims, particularly where accumulations achieve depth. Other aspects will be subject to cross loading. Outwith these areas the snowpack will remain consolidated, stable, and continue to deplete at lower elevations. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



#### Forecast Weather Influences

Light precipitation is expected in the early part of the night, this falling as snow above 800 metres leaving a dry day. Winds will be mainly from the South-West, initially gale force becoming moderate by dawn, before building to strong by the end of the period. The freezing level will be 800 metres overnight rising gradually to 1000 metres in the afternoon.
