
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

On East to South aspects, localised accumulations of moderately bonded snow will initially be encountered mainly, but not exclusively, in wind sheltered locations above 900 metres on the Northern boundary mountains of the forecast area. Consolidation will start to take place during the day as the freezing level steadily rises towards summit level. The vast majority of locations will contain limited, stable snow. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

A trace of snow above 500 metres during the early evening, followed by a dry day. Fresh Northerly winds overnight, moderating as they back to the West, before increasing again to fresh, as the day progresses. 500 metre freezing level overnight, steadily rising to reach 1200 metres by the end of the afternoon.

Comments

Freezing level continuing to fluctuate, no significant snow forecast for the next 48 hour period.
