


## THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE LOW

### Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Friday 24/02/2023

#### Avalanche Problems

#### Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

During the first half of the night isolated surface instabilities will develop mainly on steep Easterly aspects. The snowpack will then consolidate and begin to refreeze, as the night progresses, to become well bonded and stable in all locations during the day. Greatest accumulations will remain in corries and gullies with a North through East to South-East aspect above 850 metres. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



#### Forecast Weather Influences

Rain showers at all levels in the early part of the night will briefly turn to summit snow as precipitation clears to give a dry day. The freezing level will be above the summits initially falling to around 800 metres by dawn and 700 metres by the end of the day. Very strong West-North-Westerly winds overnight will ease and become Moderate Northerly during the day.
