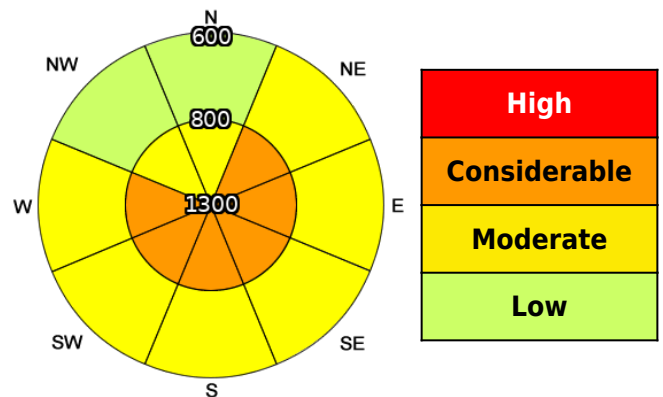
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will be mostly firm, icy and stable. However, isolated shallow deposits of windslab will be present on South-East to South-West aspects mostly above 1000m. Areas most affected are steep wind sheltered terrain such as gully tops and coire rims. The snow cover is patchy below 900m, with greatest accumulations found above this level. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

A dry day is forecast. Overnight gale force Northerly winds will ease steadily through the day becoming strong by the end of the forecast period. The freezing level will be around 500m.

Comments

High pressure will bring dry conditions and northerly winds. Snowpack will be firm and icy in most locations. Run outs present a serious hazard with many exposed rocks due to the limited snow cover.
