

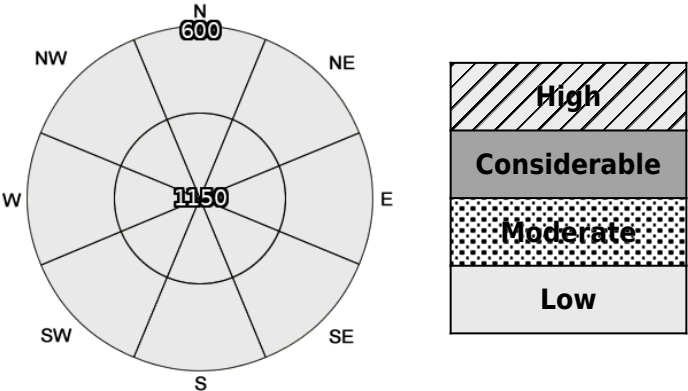

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Wednesday 08/03/2023

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

A covering of soft, unconsolidated but generally stable snow will be present on most aspects above around 600 metres. The old snowpack, which exists mainly in North and East facing corries above 900 metres, will remain well bonded, firm and stable. Minor surface instabilities possible on steep slopes exposed to the sun. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

A dry, cold, sunny day with light East-North-Easterly winds. The freezing level will rise to around 400 metres.

Comments

Old snowpack underneath fresh layer remains very icy with rocks below many steep slopes. Any slip is likely to have serious consequences.
